*Point and Line to Plane* is primarily a priori and Abstraction in Art and Nature a posteriori. They benefit from being read together. Unlike *Abstraction in Art and Nature*, this derives formal relationship through a quasi-axiomatic method, using the most elementary visual primitives. Kandinsky attempts to derive and relate intuitive and emotional responses to these forms.

The point is the most concise form but, according to its placement on the basic plane, it will take a different tonality. It can be isolated or resonate with other points or lines. A line is the product of a force which has been applied in a given direction: the force exerted on the pencil or paintbrush by the artist.

A form which, when on the otherwise empty basic plane, may still be considered to be a point, must be termed a plane when, for example, a very thin line appears with it upon the basic plane (Fig. 2)..

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*Point And Line To Plane*

Since we found a single value of  $t$  from this process, we know that the line should intersect the plane in a single point, here where  $t = 3$ . So the point of intersection can be determined by plugging this value in for  $t$  in the parametric equations of the line. Here:  $x = 2 + (3) = 5$ ,  $y = 1 + (3) = 4$ , and  $z = 3 + (3) = 6$ .
