It is a study of a certain way of thinking. In 1666, a man by the name of Sabbatai Zevi declared himself to be the Messiah. Followers of his heretical cult believed that sin is holy and should be practised for its own sake. Sabbateans and their successors, the Frankists, have indulged in religious orgies, ritual sacrifice, incest, adultery and homosexuality for 350 years.

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This notion is quite similar to that sometimes cited in the context of Sabbateanism of "redemption via sin." This belief is linked with the Lurianic doctrine of the raising of the holy sparks (ni'ot), though Besht limited this concept to the salvation of the individual soul. Hasidim believed that the immanence of God in everything meant that even great evil or pollution had a spark of the divine hidden somewhere within it.

A preliminary study on Sabbatean antinomianism "Redemption through Sin" was published in 1936 and then appeared in English in 1970. During that time, in the late 1930's, Scholem received an invitation from the Jewish Institute of Religion in New York City to deliver a series of lectures on Jewish Mysticism.
